You will also be able to download your own combination of waterways in one file, so you can obtain an up-to-date, custom guide for each cruise.





Armley Mills to Kirkstall Brewery Towpath Improvements: (29 Jun 09 until further notice): Towpath improvement works on the Leeds & Liverpool Canal. Phased works will be undertaken over approximately a 20-week period during which time sections of the towpath will need to be closed. However, efforts will be made to minimise disruption wherever possible. Suggested route diversions are shown in the maps displayed on site. We apologise for any inconvenience caused and thank you for your patience during this time. This work is a partnership scheme between BW, Leeds City Council and Sustrans to deliver an improved and more durable multi-user towpath route. Burnley to Johnsonâ s Hill: Advice (12 Aug 09 until further notice): Update (27 August 2009) Further to the information notice issued on the 12 August 2009, the blue-green algae bloom is now present on the stretch of the Leeds & Liverpool between Burnley and Johnsonâ s



Hill. ----- A suspected bloom of potentially toxic blue-green algae has been reported in the Leeds & Liverpool Canal throughout Burnley. Although blue-green algae occurs naturally in freshwater, there is a risk of serious hazard to health when they occur in high concentrations. The highest concentrations of blue green algae toxins are found in scums which can form on the water surface, and which can look like turquoise paint, grass clippings or floating mats. The toxins can affect humans, pets and livestock. You should avoid all contact with water which has a blue-green paint-like scum on its surface and also avoid contact with very green water. Immersion sports (such as paddling, swimming, and canoeing) carry a higher risk to human health and should not be practiced where there is a scum or green water present. Such conditions can come and go quickly, which means that British Waterways cannot guarantee the suitability of the water for these activities. Therefore, it is your responsibility to check for scums or green water prior to any immersion activity. Do not allow pets or livestock to swim in or drink the water. We recommend that you keep dogs on leads. If you do come into contact with the algal scum, remove contaminated clothing and wash all exposed skin in clean water as soon as possible, particularly before eating or drinking. If you are in any doubt about your welfare after contact with the algae, please seek medical advice. This advice remains in force for the foreseeable future until the bloom has subsided. Bridge 209A Shipley, Near Dockfield Road: Restriction (1 Jun 09-16 Oct 09): Bridge maintenance works - Approx. 18 week period. Shot blasting and painting from an underslung scaffold. No major disruption to waterway users should be encountered, but the on-site contractor will control if and when necessary. Maximum possible delay to waterway users will be 20 minutes in total. Lock 80, Wigan Flight: Restriction (1 Sep 09-1 Sep 09): A restriction to through navigation is required on the Leeds & Liverpool Canal at Lock 80 on the Wigan Flight in order to carry out paddle repairs. Please be advised that 48 hours notice is required for this passage. 08 until further notice): This swing bridge has become increasingly difficult to operate possibly due to a broken bearing. British Waterways engineers are working together with Yorkshire Water, the owners of Moss Swing Bridge, to investigate and repair the swing bridge as soon as possible. Contact: 0113 281 6860

River Lock: Restriction (27 Apr 07 until further notice): Due to structural problems with the lock floor, River Lock will be operated by the lock keeper only, between the hours of 8.15am and 4pm daily. It will be locked outside of these hours. British Waterways apologise for any inconvenience this may cause. Moorings will be available outside the BW Fearn's Wharf building and above River Lock. Bridge 4, Dover Bridge - Leigh Branch: Advice (28 Sep 06 until further notice): The towpath here has been temporarily closed to customers. This is due to failed timber supports on this section beneath the bridge. British Waterways apologise for any inconvenience caused. Contact: 01942 405 700

Lock 2, Poolstock Lock: Stoppage (13 Sep 08 until further notice): Update: 13.9.08 Further to our stoppage notice issued this morning for a damaged headgate at Poolstock Lock 2, the headgate has now been repaired and the navigation has been re-opened. An emergency stoppage to navigation is required at lock 2, Poolstock Locks on the Leigh Branch due to a damaged headgate on the towpath side. The duration of the works is currently unknown, however an update notice will be issued once our site investigations have taken place. Winding can be found between bridges 2a and 2b on the Leigh Branch and at the junction with the mainline canal below Henhust Lock 86. We apologise for any inconvenience. Contact: 01942 405 700

Lathom Top Lock Service Station: Advice (21 Aug 07 until further notice): This site is not connected to the main drains system and as such requires pumping out on a weekly basis which brings the annual maintenance of these facilities to in excess of £20,000 per annum. An assessment has been carried out to determine the cost of placing these services onto mains drains which has not proven to be viable. The showers have also recently suffered vandalism and require replacing for health and safety reasons. As such a review of the effectiveness of these facilities along with an assessment of the proximity to alternative services has been carried out. Alternative facilities on the Leeds & Liverpool Canal are located at the following locations:- Burscough: Bridge 32A (Toilets, Water Point, Elsan) â 1½ hour cruising Sparks Bridge 8A, Rufford Branch (Toilets, Water Point, Elsan, Pump Out, Showers) â 2 hours cruising Litherland: Bridge 2J (Toilets, Water Point, Pump Out) â 6 hours cruising Henhurst Lock 86, Wigan (Toilets, Elsan, Water Point) â 4 hours cruising In view of this, it has been decided that it is not cost effective to keep these facilities open at this location and therefore they will be closed as of 1st September 2007. However this will be on a trial basis at this stage to assess the impact that this will have on our customers. Please note that the water point will remain open.
